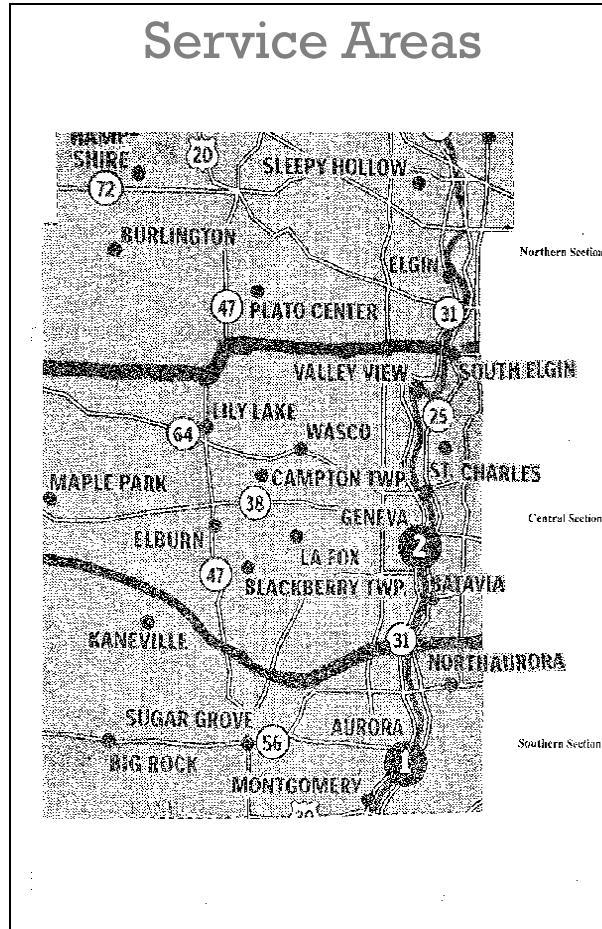

Program Overview

Four non-profit agencies are working together with area landlords to offer subsidized apartments, through grant funds from the Illinois Housing Development Authority, to extremely low and severely low income households in Kane County.

There are multiple grants, with different time frames, providing the funds. Typically, the program will provide a guaranteed payment of a portion of rent for a year with a renewal period to follow. Specifics on the duration of the subsidy will depend on when a tenant enrolls in the grant cycle.

Payment amounts are redetermined annually based on household income at the time of lease renewal.

Households Eligible to Participate

Households must meet the following criteria to be eligible:

- Fall into the extremely low or severely low income levels:
 - Household of 1—\$15,840 income limit
 - Household of 2—\$18,090 income limit
 - Household of 3—\$20,370 income limit
 - Household of 4—\$22,620 income limit
 - Household of 5—\$24,420 income limit
 - Household of 6—\$26,250 income limit
- Have stable income to pay a portion of rent and monthly utilities.
- Complete the agency income certification and landlord application process satisfactorily.
- Abide by rules listed in the lease and lease rider.

How the Program Works

- Various landlords in Northern Central and Southern Kane County have set aside a limited number of 1, 2, and 3 bedroom units for this program. Some units are handicapped accessible.
- Interested households may obtain an application packet from an agency in the area of the County where they wish to reside. (See reverse side of brochure.)
- Completed applications will be logged in on a “first come-first served basis” until the wait list is closed.
- Applicants will need to provide documentation of household size, income and assets, and the prior year’s tax return.
- Completed applications will be reviewed to verify income, and other program qualifications, to identify whether any preferences exist and to confirm bedroom size need prior to placement on the wait list.
- Available units are provided to eligible tenants on a first come, first served basis, subject to certain priority and preference categories.
- Eligible tenants must complete the landlord’s separate application process and be approved by the landlord prior to admission to the program. The landlord may conduct criminal and credit checks.
- Because of the program’s size, only a limited number of applications will be available at each agency location.

However, should agencies anticipate that not enough qualifying applications have been returned, additional applications will be available until the wait list has been closed.

- Security deposits, other fees, or tenant paid utilities are not eligible for the support program.

Other Ways Participating Agencies Help the Community

Because of the need for more affordable housing, four agencies have stepped up to obtain grant funds which enable Kane County to participate in the statewide Illinois Housing Development Authority Rental Support Program.

The agencies all provide essential, confidential services to people in Kane County. Their goal is to help those in need, referring people in need to many social service agencies in the area. They can refer people to resources for emergency shelter, employment, food pantries, low income housing, available federal and state benefits, medical care for those without benefits, and counseling and other resources for those with mental health or substance abuse concerns.
